

A Bolt of Lightning Now Swims with Dolphins

A different setting, but, a familiar job awaits CSI's VP for Finance and Administration

For the past 11 years, Milton Santiago worked for Lehman College, a Bronx CUNY that has a healthy rivalry with CSI.

Now, the 26-year veteran of higher education, Santiago will serve as CSI's Vice President for Finance and Administration. When the women's tennis team faces off against Lehman's ladies at the end of this month, Santiago will know where his loyalties now lie, he said.

"I'm a true blue Dolphin," said VP Santiago without hesitation in an interview with The Banner.

The question of athletic loyalties may seem trivial to some of the other questions that have pressed CSI in recent months.

Soon after VP Santiago joined the CSI administration, Governor David Paterson announced that he would propose \$1 billion in cuts to the state budget. Gov. Paterson's plan outlined a \$50 million cut in state funding to the CUNY system's budget.
